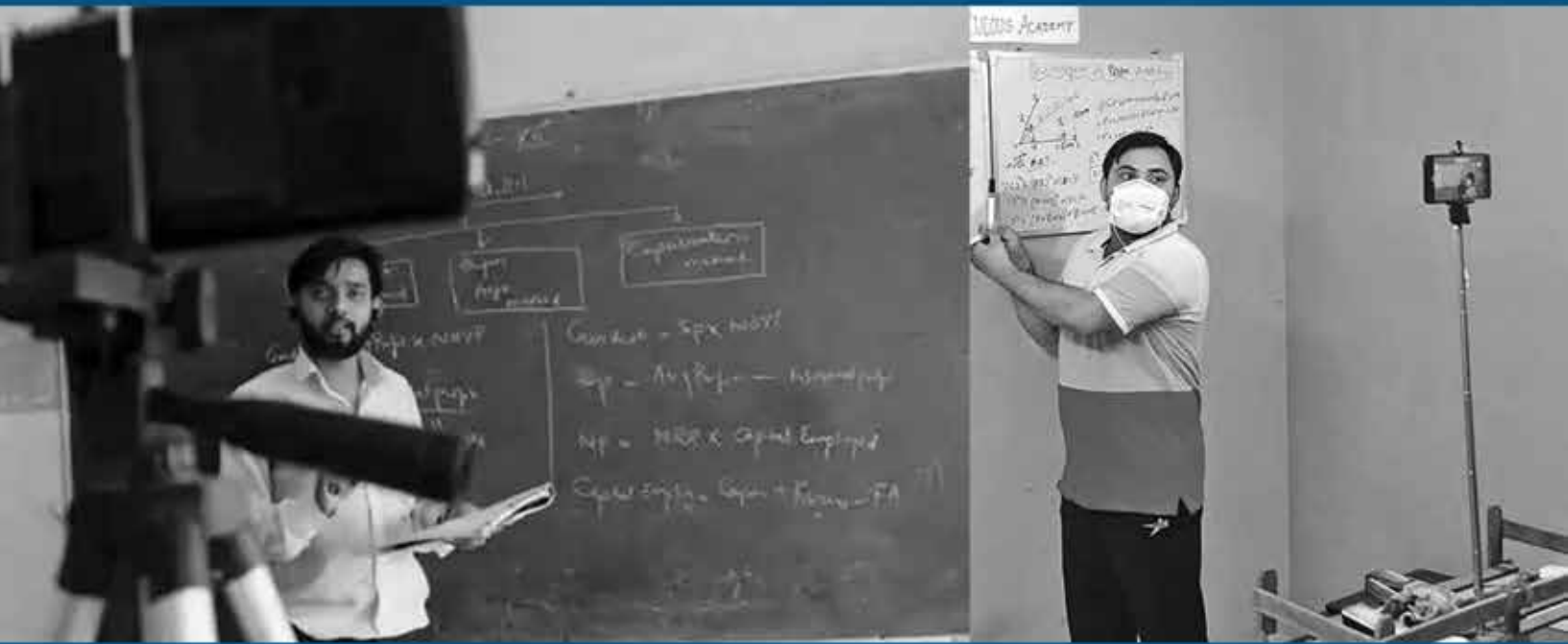

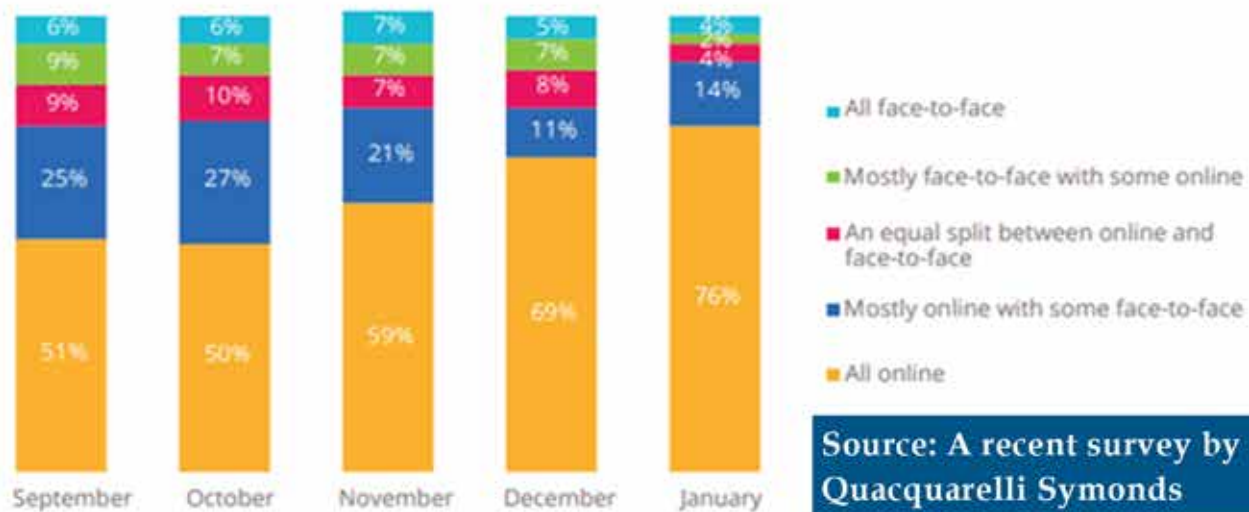

The Pandemic and New Learning Space



A dark space does not remain dark for long; human ingenuity dispels darkness through creation of light hitherto unknown. Prior to the pandemic, classrooms remained as they had been; face to face contact of the teacher and the taught. Sars-Cov-2 made a dramatic change to the established. Online and blended learning became the norm. The screen kindled a new interest. Even grandmothers learnt how to be on the virtual space. All these happened in just a year. The human civilization built over the years brick by brick learnt that adversity was the best teacher and what it could teach in a short time during adversity far outweighs the slow but steady process of the delivery process of education during the so-called "normal".

A recent survey by Quacquarelli Symonds shows how the educational space has undergone a change in terms of delivery of education through internet.

The chart given above taken from the recent survey by Quacquarelli Symonds reveals how more and more institutions have gradually moved to completely online educational space: while 51% of students were being taught completely online in September 2020, as high as 76% were receiving online education in January 2021.

Teaching face-to-face, and mostly face-to-face with some online teaching, declined from 6% to 4%, and 9% to 2%, respectively, between the periods from September 2020 to January 2021.

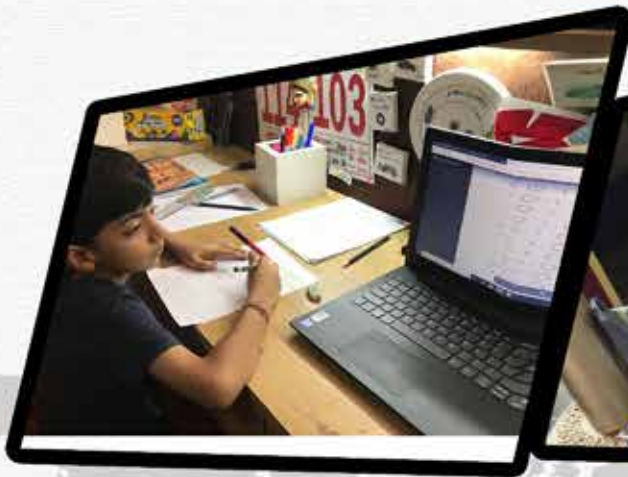
Interestingly, those that chose mostly online with some face-to-face teaching also witnessed a decline from 25% in September 2020 to 14% in January 2021. On one hand, these data reflect the escalating conditions of the crisis caused by the pandemic in many countries, and at the same time show how the threats were so brilliantly converted into new opportunities and avenues.

The lesson learnt from the pandemic is that life as a whole is a winner and must raise its head even in the most adverse of circumstances.

It is clear that a vast majority of institutions have introduced and subsequently increased their online teaching and learning efforts throughout the crisis and the Heritage is no exception.



Vitual Classes - the new normal amidst COVID-19



A student of HITK wins at MIT Covid-19 Challenge Hackathon 2020 participated by 1750 volunteers, 238 teams and 96 countries around the world



It was early March 2020. The US and the world were bracing for the outbreak of a dangerous viral pandemic caused by Covid-19. Most members of MIT community had left the campus for their respective homes –many of them to countries abroad. For Alfonso Martinez MBA '20 and Freddy T. Nguyen, the Arnold O. Beckman Postdoctoral Fellow at MIT's Institute for Medical Engineering and Science and a pathology resident at Mount Sinai Hospital, there was only one logical response: a hackathon.

“We had an impending pandemic that was going to create myriad problems across the globe,” says Nguyen, a co-organizer, along with Martinez, of the MIT Covid-19 Challenge. Since March, the MIT community-led initiative has staged seven hackathons addressing the pandemic. “We needed to define the problems facing us and create a structure that could produce solutions quickly. At the same time, we had hundreds of our people with mad skills confined to their homes with nowhere to apply those skills. From our perspective, a hackathon was a no-brainer.” Martinez and Nguyen first met at the 2018 MIT Hacking Medicine Grand Hack –the annual MIT health care hackathon where Nguyen served as co-director, and where Martinez conceived auggi,

the consumer health startup he would develop during his time at Sloan. On March 21, the pair virtually convened 200 MIT collaborators for a Covid-19 IDEathon, through which they drafted a preliminary list of priorities to help face the most immediate challenges of the global pandemic.

The event was more than proof of concept; it was proof of need. A series of virtual hackathons followed, all in rapid succession, and with rapidly swelling ranks. Approximately 1800 people from 49 US states and 96 countries convened online between April 3-5 for beating the Pandemic. More than 200 multidisciplinary teams presented to a panel of judges their proposals suggesting ways to protect the US health care system from being overwhelmed by Covid-19.

Participants soon realized that a global pandemic presents different challenges in different regions of the globe. “The problem may be the same, but the local ecosystem redefines the way we need to respond,” says Nguyen. “In the US the person prescribing treatment isn't the person paying for treatment. In other regions they might be. There are problems of electricity, access to testing, and misinformation that vary from place to place.”

PROTECTING VULNERABLE POPULATIONS

How to protect vulnerable populations from the effects of COVID-19?

Track A. Expanding and improving access to COVID-19 education and resources: How do we keep community residents with limited/poor access to COVID-19 information and available community resources up-to-date to ensure basic needs are being met (e.g. shelters, pantries)? As telehealth becomes essential and remote monitoring tools are adopted, how do we ensure that vulnerable populations are connected, have access, and can utilize high-speed internet options quickly (i.e. reduce the complicated process to show eligibility)?

1750 volunteers from 49 states and 96 countries gathered to participate in this MIT Covid-19 Challenge 2020- Beat the Pandemic.

It is a matter of great pride that one of our student of HITK, Chirag Agarwal, B.Tech-ECE, Batch-2022, was a member of the winning team in the MIT Covid-19 Challenge 2020 organized between April 3-5, 2020.

A Brief Description

HITK Alumna in the Covid-19 Vaccine Team at the University of Oxford

Indian women have been more and more innovative in the fight against novel coronavirus. An Indian woman who has recently been in the news is Kolkata's Chandra Datta. Datta is an alumna of HITK, B.Tech-Biotechnology, Batch-2008. She played a significant role in the development and trial of a vaccine to counter COVID-19.

The 34-year-old Oxford resident works as a quality assurance manager at the Jenner Institute, University of Oxford. The University facility has created the anti-viral vector vaccine – ChAdOx1 nCoV-19. They started to do trials on humans last week.

“After I have checked all the paper work, the quality professional certifies the lot that he is happy that the vaccine is subject to a clinical trial. It happened on Wednesday with the Covid-19 vaccine,” she told TOI adding, “It was an incredible experience..”

After finishing her M.Sc from Leeds University, Chandra worked in several roles before getting the job at Oxford, where she works at the University's Clinical Biomanufacturing Facility. It manufactured viral vector vaccines for early-phase clinical trials all over the world and is manufacturing the Covid-19 vaccine developed at the Jenner Institute.



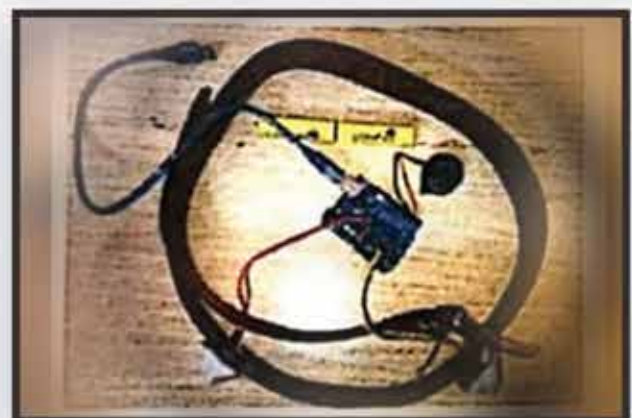

Rotaract Club of HITK developed an interesting video, showing how 'free time' could be smartly utilized, thereby eliminating boredom and reducing concomitant stress.

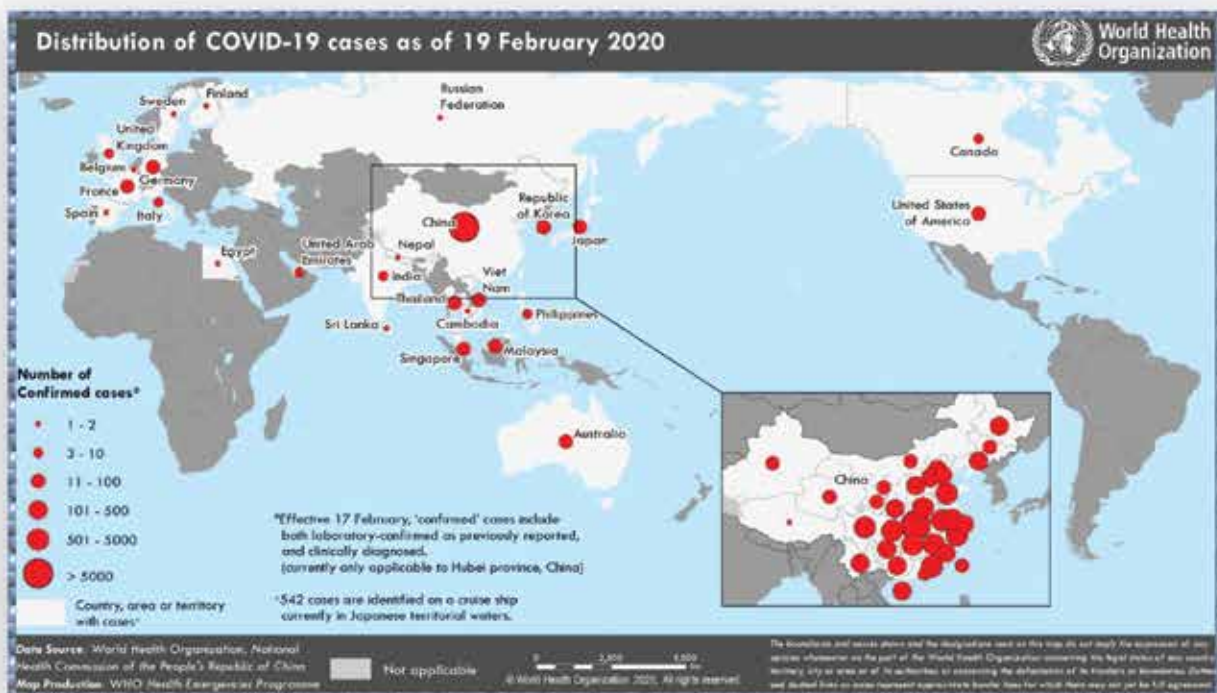

Breath Responsive Respirator

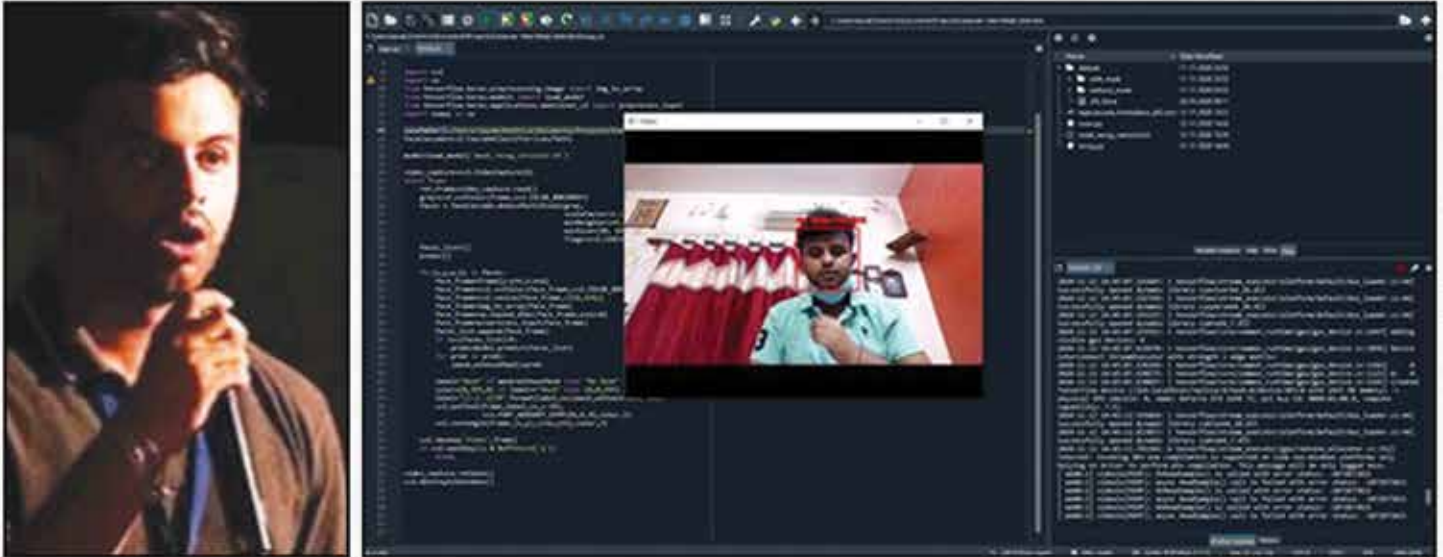
Fully operational Research and Development laboratory on COVID 19 during this period was functional. Dr. Sukanta Saha, Assistant Professor, Mechanical Engineering Department, HITK, was working on Prototype of Breath Responsive Respirator (BRR) and the same effectively passed the clinical trials. Some exclusive features of the research project is that the BRR requires only 25-30 % power as compared to the standard power respirators and is very much cost effective, Moreover, it is simple to use and can be controlled effectively.



Custom Mask Detector- preventing Covid-19

As a part of research project, Sayak Banerjee, a student of B.Tech- CSE, Batch-2020, HITK, had made a 'Custom Mask Detector for Covid-19' using Transfer Learning on MobileNetV2. This detector will detect anyone who is not wearing a mask.

MobileNetV2 is a very effective feature extractor for object detection and segmentation.



Music App to beat Covid-19 Quarantine

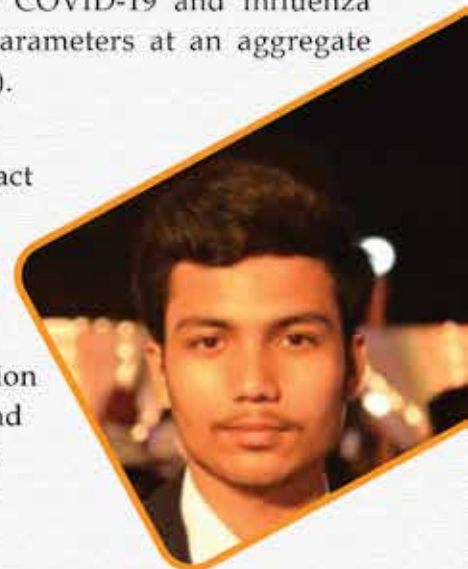

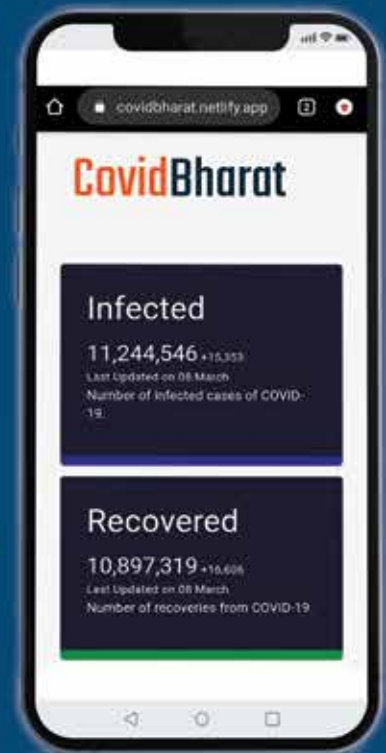
FluDemic - Analysis of COVID-19 time-series data

Aniketo Ghosh, an alumnus of HITK, B.Tech- ECE, Batch-2019, is currently working as a Research Associate at ArcVision Technologies. He was actively involved in the Project on 'FluDemic - Analysis of COVID-19 time-series data at the state & country level' since September 2020. His present study in the project consists of:

1. Modelling, characterization and prediction of time series data of COVID-19 and influenza based on various parameters at an aggregate level (state/country).
2. Creating a socio-economic impact analysis from data. Finding time-delay of various factors, attributing them to the correct distribution (weibull, gamma) and using that to predict factors these delays influence.

The same is quite different from Arogya Setu of India or BlueTrace of Singapore which demands the use of BLE enable smartphones.

This app helps in Covid-19 contact tracing not only for normal people but also people with disabilities even in an area which is out of Pandemic control.

Take the case of Heritage School, which was one of the first to take online tests. All kids up to Class IX are taking these tests, each 30-minute long, in a special online exam portal after logging in with their unique user ID and password. Teachers, too, have their own ID and password to set papers in the multiple-choice mode. The school has completed a round of tests in all subjects already. "To add to the security measures, we have asked a parent/guardian to be present on camera while the test is on," said Souvik Jati, academic co-ordinator of the school.

TIPS TO REDUCE ANXIETY

- Let them be some personal touch in the exam, let teachers come into the virtual exam hall and talk reassuringly to students at the start of the exam.
- Counsel students against unfair means because just stepping up high will make students feel uncomfortable.
- Personal conversation with each student must start and let communication not be restricted to academics alone.
- Assessment must be done in a way that encourages the student to do better rather than assess him for what he doesn't know.
- Parents must come in as responsible stakeholders.

School & Higher education has not been immune to the impacts of COVID-19 and, in many ways, has been acutely affected. 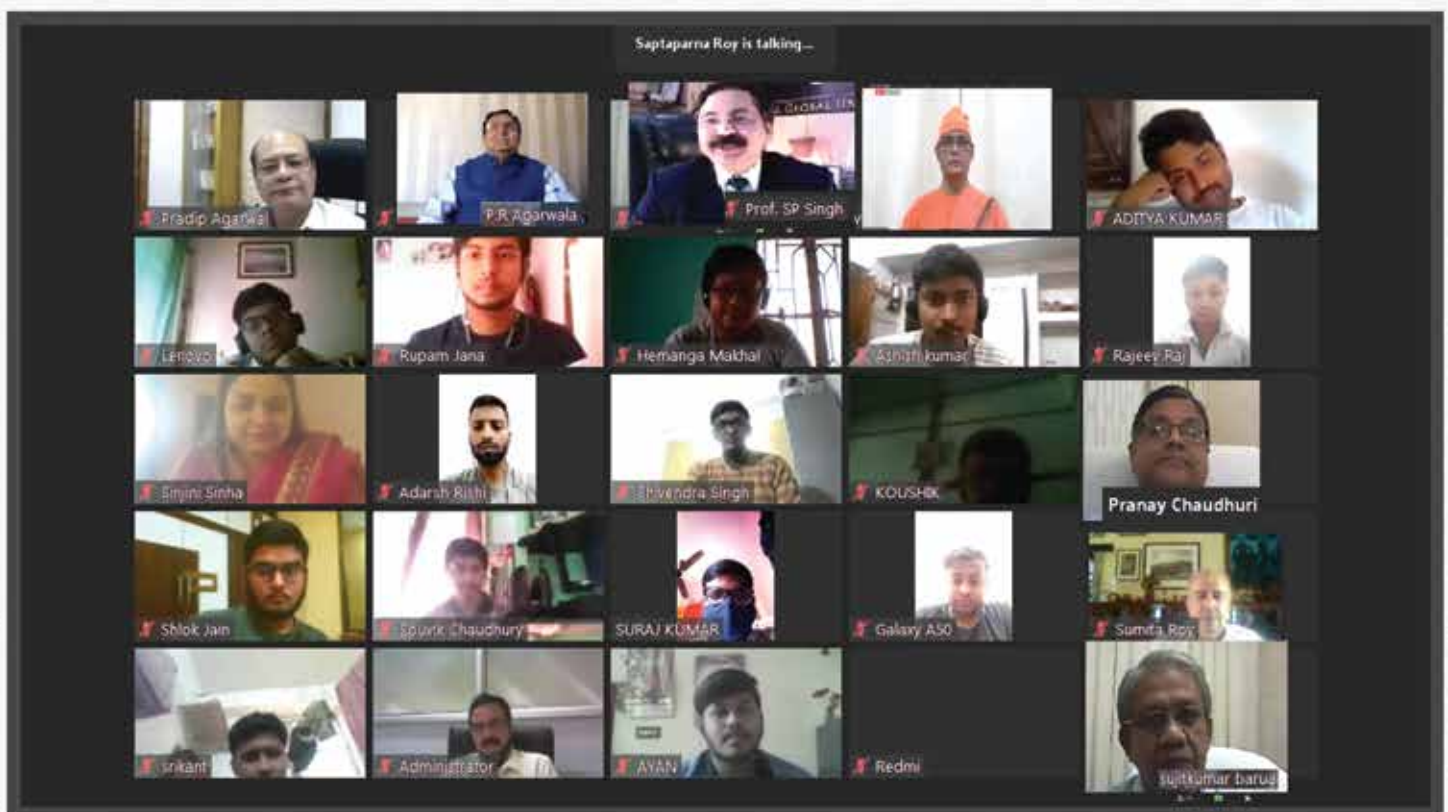
Swami Atmapriyanadaji Maharaj during his inaugural address spoke about simplicity, positive thoughts, respect for yourself, which are the essential qualities every

South Kol woman in Oxford sprint for Covid vaccine

Oxford: A Kolkata woman is playing a crucial role in the Oxford University team trying to develop a vaccine against Covid-19, which could potentially end the pandemic.

Chandra Datta, 31, who lives in Oxford, is working as a quality assurance manager at the university facility which is manufacturing the anti-viral vector vaccine—ChAdOx1 nCoV-29s—which went into human trials last Thursday.

If the vaccine passes these trials, it could be available to the public by September or October, she said.

Chandra, who hails from Golf Gardens in Tollymore, went to Gokhale Memorial Girls' School and has a B.Tech in engineering and biotechnology at the Heritage Institute of Technology. She moved to the UK in 2009 to study for an MSc in bioscience (biotechnology) at Leeds University.

She then worked in several roles before landing her plum job at Oxford, where she also works at the university's Clinical Bio-manufacturing Facility which manufactures viral vector vaccines for early-phase clinical trials all over the world, and is manufacturing the Covid-19 vaccine developed at the Jenner Institute.

Chandra oversees the quality assurance side of vaccine manufacturing, making sure procedures and methods are compliant, correcting any problems.

"After I have checked all the paperwork, the quality professional does certification of the batch that he is happy for the vaccine to go to clinical trial. That happened on Wednesday with the Covid-19 vaccine. It was a big day. We had a big celebration. We all had wine and cake on Zoom together," said Chandra, who is currently working from home.

Chandra said, "It has been an amazing experience." "I have always worked in the pharmaceutical industry and I feel that making human life better is our goal. But I have never experienced anything like this before. It feels great and I think the whole world wants this vaccine so life can return to normality."

She had initially worked on the vaccine in secret because it was confi-

dential, she revealed. "The last one month everyone has been really pressured, but we got it done very quickly. There has been a massive team effort," she said. "I don't work in distribution but from what I have heard, we are planning to start mass manufacture at Serum Institute in Pune before trial passes so that it can go to the market as soon as trial passes," she said.

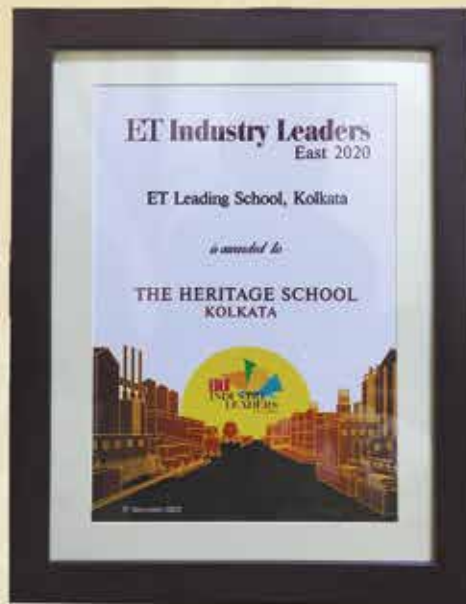
